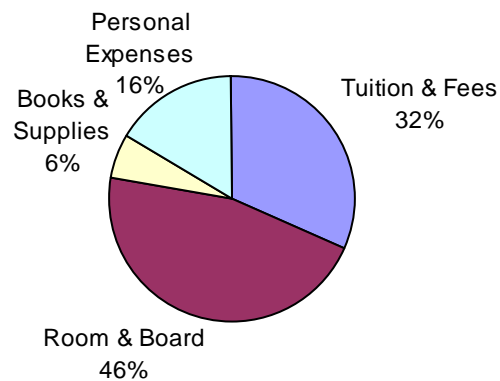

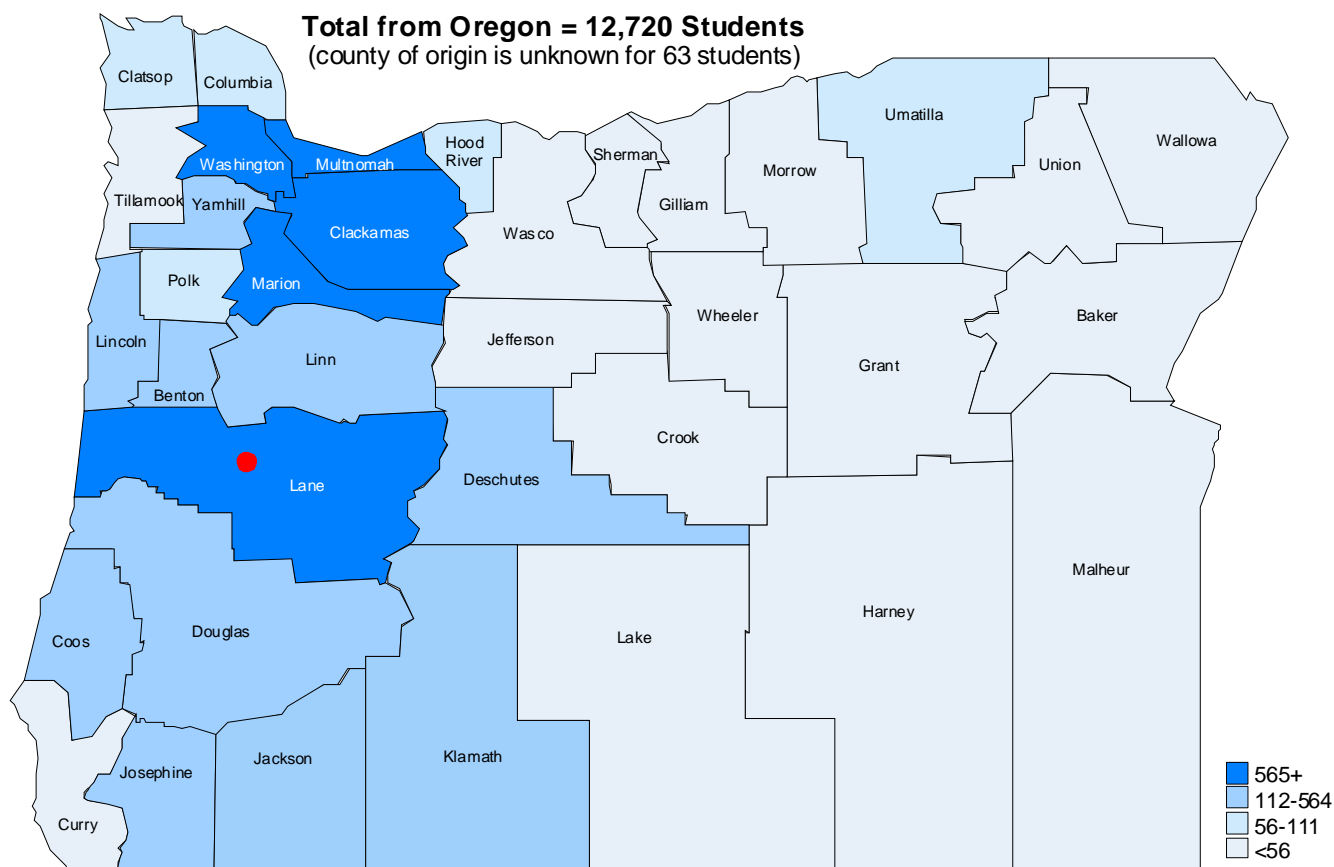
**Resident Undergraduate
