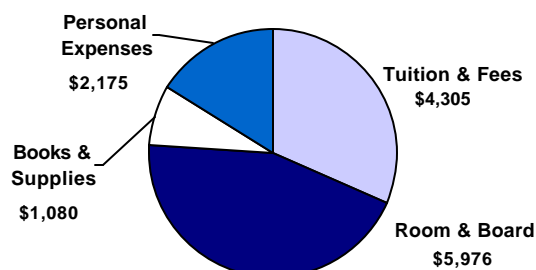

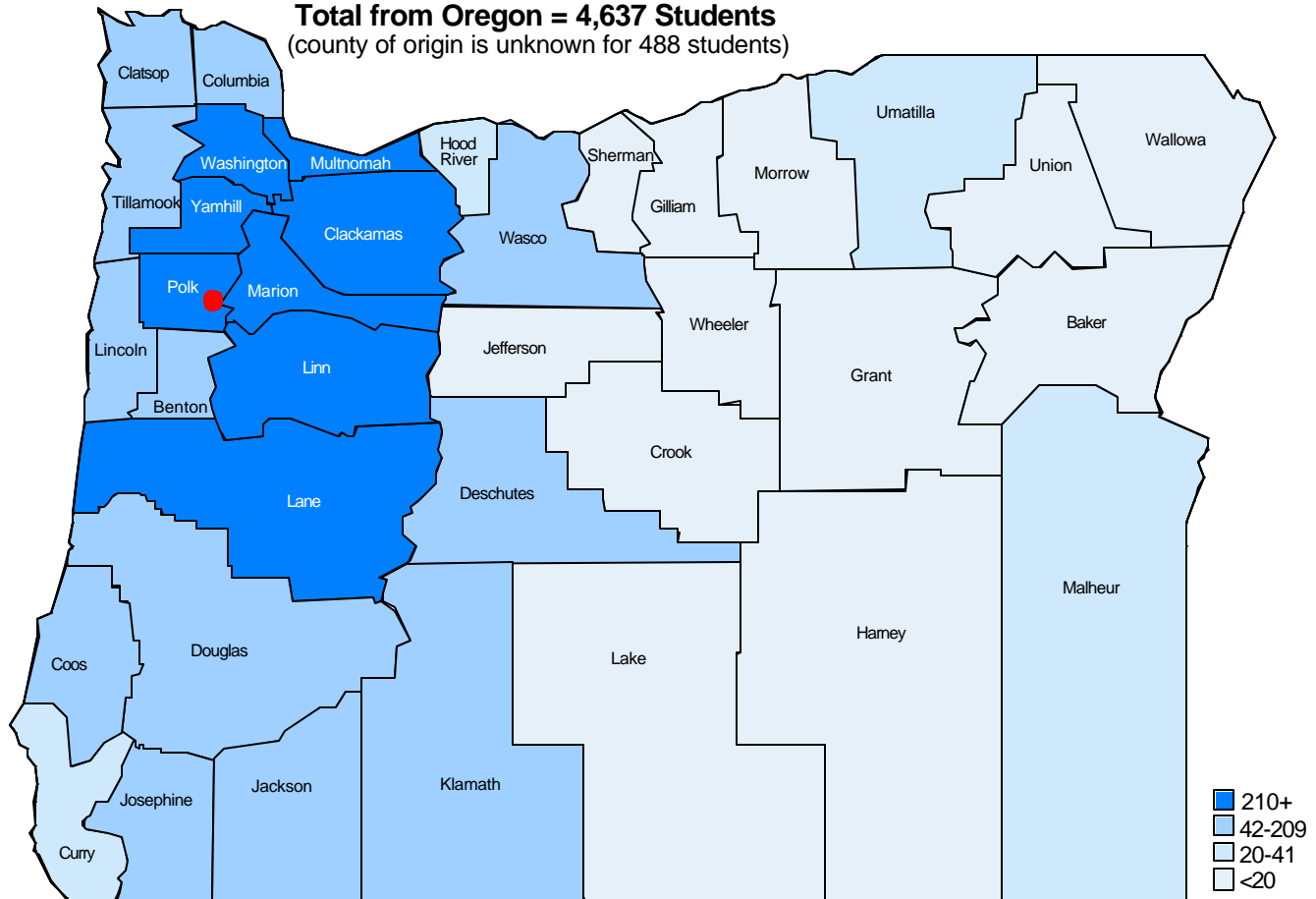
Resident Undergraduate Student Budget, 2003-04
