Every year thousands of students transfer from Oregon community colleges to one of the seven institutions within the Oregon University System (OUS). Working together, the Governor, legislature, community colleges, and OUS institutions have developed several programs to help students successfully and smoothly make this transition.

Transfer Without Degree

After graduating from high school, many students choose to attend a community college instead of a four year institution. Some choose this option because it's more economical, while others find

it a good place to brush up their skills and polish their academic credentials. Also, many high school graduates, lacking a clear career direction, find that getting some work experience and trying a variety of general education courses available at the community colleges helps them decide whether they want or need a four year degree. Students who decided to transfer to a four-year institution should check with that school for its specific requirements (see web site information listed above). All OUS institutions have a minimum GPA and number of credit hour requirements that students must meet to be eligible for transfer.

Dual Enrollment Opportunities

All seven OUS institutions have partnership agreements with community colleges that allow a community college student to be formally enrolled at a community college and an OUS school at the same time. Referred to as dual-enrollment or co-admission programs, the benefit to the student is a greater access to courses (which allows more flexibility in scheduling), the ability to take upper division courses at the OUS campus while taking general education classes at the community college, integrated financial aid administration, and ease of transfer to the four-year school. For more information, please contact the Admissions Office at your campus.

Oregon Transfer Module (OTM) 45 Credit (1 Year) Program

The Oregon Transfer Module is a 45 credit subset of general education courses representing the first year of general education coursework. It is accepted at all public, postsecondary institutions in Oregon. Students who transfer after completing the OTM know all their credits will be accepted by the four-year institution. In addition to completing a minimum of 45 credits, students must pass each class with a C- or better, maintain at least a 2.0 GPA, and each class must be worth at least 3 credits. Please see an advisor to find out which classes at your community college count towards the Oregon Transfer Module. AA/OT (Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer) Degree 90 Credit (2 Year) Degree

Community college students who earn an AA/OT degree have met, in full, all the lower division general education requirements for any OUS campus to which they transfer AND have junior status at that OUS campus for registration purposes. All 17 of Oregon's community colleges offer an AA/OT degree that meets the general guidelines (for a description of the general guidelines, please go to www.ous.edu/stucoun/prospstu/files/jbac_desc_arts_otd.pdf.) Also, please be sure to consult your community college advisor or course catalog for the specific requirements at your campus.

AS/OT-Bus (Associate of Science/Oregon Transfer in Business) Degree 90 Credit (2 Year) Degree

Like the AA/OT degree, students who earn an AS/OT-Bus degree have met, in full, all the lower division general education requirements for any OUS campus to which they transfer AND have junior status at that OUS campus for registration purposes. However, this degree is not offered by all community colleges. Additionally, completion of this degree does not guarantee admission to an OUS business school/program. Students who choose this degree are advised to coordinate their course selections with both their community college advisor and an advisor in the business school/program at the OUS campus to which they will transfer to ensure that any additional prerequisites have been completed. Oregon Student Assistance Commission & Financial Aid

Oregon Student Assistance Commission & Financial Aid

The Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC) is the state agency that administers 1) the Oregon Opportunity Grant, a need-based grant for Oregon resident undergraduates, 2) more than 350 privately funded scholarship programs on behalf of donors, and 3) many other public programs that benefit students. OSAC also administers Access to Student Assistance Programs In Reach of Everyone (ASPIRE) that coordinates volunteer-mentors in more than 100 Oregon high schools. OSAC staff has the responsibility for providing information and training about student financial aid to high school counselors; students and their families; and to the general public. Additionally, they provide leadership within the higher education financial community, and scholarship design and administrative services to prospective donors.

Grants and Scholarships Division

The Grants and Scholarships Division administers state-sponsored grant and loan programs, federal programs, and private scholarship programs. The programs currently administered are:

1. **Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG)** for financially needy undergraduate Oregon residents: This is the largest state-funded need-based program for students working on an undergraduate degree (income eligibility information can be found on the OSAC website). Award amounts vary, based on a student's financial need & the type of institution the student will be attending.
2. **Privately funded scholarships for more than 350 need-based and merit-based programs:** These scholarships range from small, one-time awards for graduates of a particular high school to large, renewable scholarships available to many students throughout the state. To apply, applicants must submit a complete "application packet"

- to OSAC by the deadline (**March 1**). Additionally, many programs also require the applicant to file a FAFSA as soon after Jan. 1st as possible. Failure to follow directions and submit all required documents is the biggest reason applicants are rejected.
3. **The Chafee Education and Training Grant** for former foster youths: This program serves individuals who have spent at least one year in foster care between the ages of 16 and 21 and who enroll in college not later than 3 years from the date they leave foster care or graduate from high school.
 4. **Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program:** This is a federally funded program that provides renewable awards to academically high-achieving high school seniors from each of Oregon's five congressional districts. As a merit-based program, the applicant is not required to file a FAFSA (although it is strongly encouraged for other possible sources of financial aid).
 5. **Individual Education Accounts (IEA)** in the JOBS Plus Program: Participants qualify through the JOBS Plus Program, which is open to Temporary Assistance for Needy Families clients.
 6. **Deceased and Disabled Public Safety Officer Grant:** This program is available to the natural, adopted, or stepchild of any Oregon public safety officer who was killed or disabled in the line of duty. For complete requirements and an application package, contact OSAC.
 7. **Oregon Youth Conservation Corps (OYCC) Program:** This program provides education, training, and employment opportunities to disadvantaged and at-risk youth from 16 to 25 years of age. Recipients must participate in the OYCC Community Corps program.
 8. **Oregon Rural Health Services and Oregon Nursing Services Programs:** These are loan repayment programs to encourage health care workers to choose both geographic areas and specific areas of practice where there are shortages in Oregon.
 9. **Oregon Nursing Services Program:** This loan repayment program is available to registered nurses practicing in designated critical nursing shortage areas and specified practice specialties through Oregon. Applications are due in February. Visit the OSAC website for the application.
 10. **Employer Tax Credit Program:** This program encourages Oregon businesses to set up scholarships for their employees and their employees' dependents by providing 50% tax credit for the scholarship funds. Interested employers should contact OSAC for additional information.

Residence Classification of Members of Oregon Tribes

The Oregon State Board of High Education, at its July 16, 1998 meeting, approved the following rule pertaining to residency classification for members of Oregon tribes:

OAR 580-010-0037

(1) Students who are enrolled as members of federally recognized tribes of Oregon or who are enrolled members of a Native American tribe which had traditional and customary tribal boundaries that included parts of the state of Oregon or which had ceded or reserved lands within the state of Oregon shall be assessed resident tuition regardless of their state of residence.

(2) For purposes of this rule, the federally recognized tribes of Oregon are:

- (a) Burns Paiute Tribe
- (b) Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw
- (c) Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Community of Oregon
- (d) Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians of Oregon
- (e) Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation
- (f) Confederated Tribes of

Warm Springs Indian Reservation

- (g) Coquille Indian Tribe
- (h) Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians
- (i) Klamath Tribes
