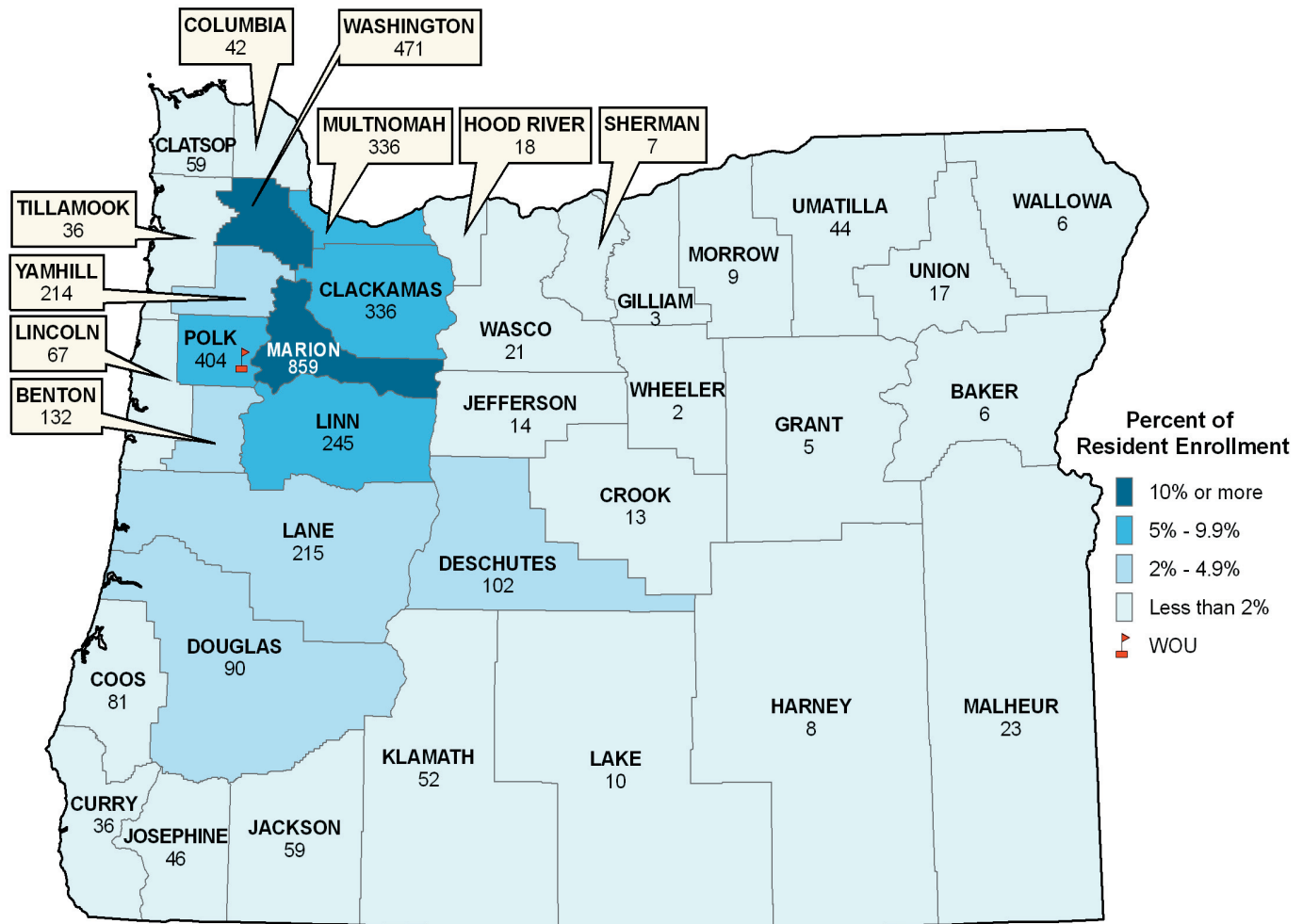

Total from outside Oregon = 451



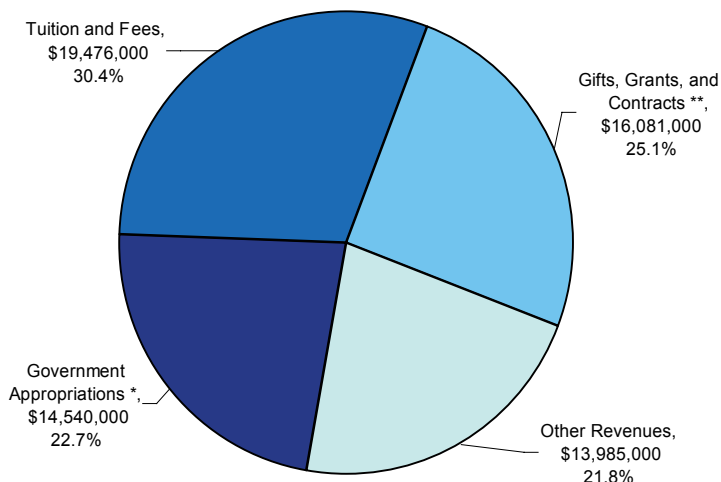

**Campus Facilities: 2005**

**Current Projects**

- **Renovation of Department of Police standards and Practices Building:** This building will be vacated as of July 2006. The Governor has allocated 14 million for its renovation no later than the 07-09 biennium. It will house the Business, Computer Science, and Mathematics Departments in modern facilities with updated computer laboratories, faculty offices and “smart” classrooms.

**Facilities Needs**

- We are in deed of a **Wellness and Recreation center** to offset the lack of student entertainment and recreation opportunities in the City of Monmouth. The existence of such a facility is necessary for student recruitment, retention and quality of life issues. Plans for such a facility are underway and will be presented in the 07-09 biennium for funding no later than in the 09-11 biennium. Private fund raising for this project is beginning now. The cost of such a facility is in the 13-17 million dollar range. It is anticipated that 1/4 to 1/2 of the funding for such a facility will be from non state and non E&G and non-student fee funding.
